



Confirmation Project Requirements 2011-2012

- ✚ Each Confirmation child is to choose one project. It does not have to be one on the accompanying sheet. You may have your own ideas.
- ✚ Decide on specifics and complete the information sheet. Turn in to Goretta Center by December 1, 2011 for approval.
- ✚ Keep a record, journal, or diary of everything you do for your project. Take pictures for your display. Your display may be in the form of a standing poster, a scrapbook, a report, or any other creative option you choose. Your name must be on it. You will include the display paper info included here with your display.
- ✚ Project must be completed, and display brought in Sat., April 28th between 9 AM and 11 AM and set up in Piper Hall. Each child will have a designated space with his/her name on a table. The space will be 24"x15".
- ✚ On Sun., Apr. 29th, between the 9AM and 11AM masses (from approximately 10AM to 11AM), the child should be standing next to his/her display. This is similar to a science fair.
- ✚ Projects will be returned to the children at their next atrium session.

Some Ideas for Confirmation Projects

Organize a “bake and take cookie day.” Invite friends, family, groups, to bake cookies and wrap in packages. (Maybe 2 or 3 cookies each) and donate them to a local charity.

Organize a neighborhood clean up day.

Collect non-perishable food to donate to a local charity.

Collect empty soda cans and turn them in for money to donate to a worthy cause.

Have a party and ask everyone to bring a new unwrapped toy or game to be donated to Maggie’s Place or other organization.

Round up your friends and head on over to help unload donated items at Welcome to America.

Coordinate a book drive and collect used books in good condition to donate to children at a school in a low income area.

Arrange to visit a nursing home and decorate the doors of people’s rooms with Christmas Décor.

Sign up for the PF Chang “Kids Rock” Marathon and run the last mile of the race in January. Sign up now, compete in the “design the official race t-shirt”. Collect pledges for your registration. Go online and participate in all of the activities leading up to the race.

Go online and find out about things you can do, like Operation Kid to Kid and others.
